Safe Travel

When students return home during the breaks using any of the airlines, we strongly encourage parents with children under the age of 15 to use the Unaccompanied Minor (UM) service provided by the airlines. This costs you nothing but gives you some assurance that your child will be escorted to you safely. Residential staff take your children to the airport and make sure they are safely through to customs and immigration, but after that they



are on their own. We collect them from the arrivals area once they have cleared customs and immigration. If you do not wish to use the Unaccompanied Minor service we would ask you to complete a release of liability form.
