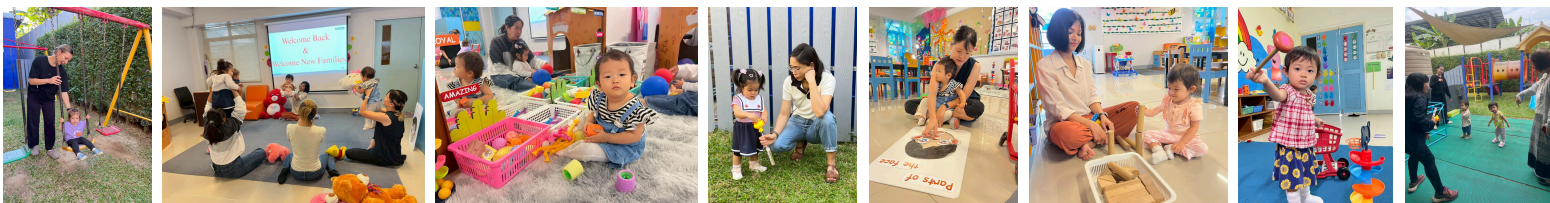


## MINI & MI SESSION 2

In the PYP ATL (Approaches to Learning) skills help children learn how to learn. One important ATL skill is self-management.

Self-management skills help children succeed in school, work, and life. Self-management means children learn to:

- control their feelings
- think before acting
- stay calm when stressed
- stay focused and try their best

At school, we teach students how to set simple goals, work toward their goals, stay organized, and practice self-discipline. These skills help children become more independent and confident learners.

Parents can help their children improve self-management skills at home by:

- keeping daily routines (morning, homework, bedtime)
- encouraging children to try tasks by themselves
- giving simple choices (two options)
- helping children break big tasks into small steps
- praising effort, not just results

When children practice self-management every day, they build skills that support their learning now and in the future.
